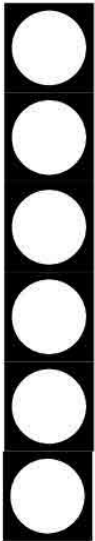


DSC Tips at November 15, 2016 Meeting

- When printing greeting cards, glossy finish uses 1/3 as much ink as matte.
- Choosing how many pixels:
 - e-mail 75 – 100
 - printing 200 minimum
 - color photo 300
 - old black & white 400, set the printer at grey tones
- If you want no borders, you may have to change the option in the printer as well as in the greeting card program.
- A good gift idea is to take pictures of interest to a friend and make a set of greeting cards or note cards using these pictures.
- To find which embellishments were used on your Scrapbook Factory page, double click on the embellishment and it will tell you the source.
- Remember: **Right clicking is your friend.**

CUTOUTS



To achieve the effect that Lou Leonard showed us in Scrapbook Factory (I used 5)(Lou actually used Greeting Card Factory but they are very similar in setup):

After opening your project Choose:

1. ADD ITEMS, then
2. ADD CUSTOM SHAPE, then choose moon and move slider to make a circle, then
3. Choose OBJECT, then CUTOUT, then
4. Resize your circle/square smaller by moving corner of selection, then
5. Choose HOME and DUPLICATE as often as desired, then Choose ARRANGE, then ALIGN, then TOP TO BOTTOM (You can change the gap between each circle/square by changing the number from 0 to .1 or whatever you desire)

There are probably ways to achieve this effect in other programs. Try searching help for CUTOUTS.
